



# **Case Summary...Waylon**

### **Patient**

Waylon, Yellow Labrador, 6 yr, M/N

### **Problem**

Waylon presented for an initial evaluation. Two weeks ago he was playing Frisbee in the yard with the other dog, jumped and both came down on the ground. He was 3 legged, next day still very sore. They went to the emergency veterinarian, who took x-rays and recommended seeing an orthopedic specialist. He did prescribe rest and Deramaxx. Waylon has been taking a glucosamine supplement since Oct 05. He has had some chiropractic adjustments in the past and a history of some jammed toes.

Waylon is an active agility competitor. He occasionally gets stiff on the left hind leg and strained pectoral muscle in Nov 05. He has had a small growth removed from the inside of the left hind.

### **Physical Examination**

**Gait** 3/5 lameness left forelimb, worsens with speed, primarily seen in the advancement phase of gait **Diagnosis** Brachial Plexus injury left shoulder—mild to moderate

# K laser Treatment [Daily]

**Intensity & Frequency** 2 watts 100 Hz **Time & Location** 4 minutes shoulder **Comments** MANUAL #6

## **Other Treatments**

### **Initial additional therapies**

Hako Med Whirlpool/E-stim Neurontin 100 mg two tablets twice a day Underwater treadmill Chiropractic adjustments

### **Current Update**

**Medical Assessment 2/27/06** dog much more comfortable, using leg better both outside and in UWT at a walk, tentative at a trot, active range of motion better, only painful when abducting limb from body.
